#### Daniel 2: 12-13 (NASB)

Because of this the king became indignant and very furious and gave orders to destroy all the wise men of Babylon. So the decree went forth that the wise men should be slain; and they looked for Daniel and his friends to kill them.

# Why is the king putting an order out to kill Daniel?

#### Daniel 2: 14 (NASB)


Then Daniel replied with discretion and discernment to Arioch, the captain of the king's bodyguard, who had gone forth to slay the wise men of Babylon;

How old is Daniel? Around 17 years old. Who is Daniel speaking

Arioch, the king's hitman sent to kill him.

This is the commander over the Babylonian military. This man is ruthless and could very well be the same man who is responsible for

2 Kings 25: 7



#### 2 Kings 25:7 (NLT)

They made Zedekiah watch as they slaughtered his sons. Then they gouged out Zedekiah's eyes, bound him in bronze chains, and led him away to Babylon.

#### Daniel 2: 15 (NASB)

he said to Arioch, the king's commander, "For what reason is the decree from the king so urgent?" Then Arioch informed Daniel about the matter.

How did Daniel reply?

With calm and confidence. Note that he was not in a panic or pleading for his life.

Do you think the king's number one hit man often explained his actions before killing his victims?

Why is Daniel so calm and confident when facing the executioner sent to kill him?

### What Gift did God give to Daniel?

#### Daniel 1: 16 (NASB)

As for these four youths, God gave them knowledge and intelligence in every branch of literature and wisdom; Daniel even understood all kinds of visions and dreams.

# Do you think Daniel knew God gave him this ability?

#### Daniel 2: 16 (NASB)

So Daniel went in and requested of the king that he would give him time, in order that he might declare the interpretation to the king.

How many people do you think the king's hit man brought to the king instead of obeying the king's orders to kill them?

Do you think the king's hit man put his neck on the line?

## What did the wise men request?

Time

## What did Daniel request?

Why did the king respond with a different answer to Daniel?

#### Daniel 1: 9 (NASB)

Now God granted Daniel favor and compassion in the sight of the commander of the officials,

#### Daniel 1: 20 (NASB)

As for every matter of wisdom and understanding about which the king consulted them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians and conjurers who were in all his realm.

#### Daniel 2: 17-18 (NASB)

Then Daniel went to his house and informed his friends, Hananiah, Mishael and Azariah, about the matter, so that they might request compassion from the God of heaven concerning this mystery,

#### Daniel 2: 17-18 (NASB)

so that Daniel and his friends would not be destroyed with the rest of the wise men of Babylon.

## What did Daniel do after speaking to the king?

He and his fellow believers dropped to their knees in prayer!

### What can we learn from Daniel?

You face a crisis on your knees!

#### Daniel 2: 19 (NASB)

During the night the mystery was revealed to Daniel in a vision. Then Daniel praised the God of heaven and said:

#### Daniel 2: 20-23 (NASB)

"Praise be to the name of God for ever and ever; wisdom and power are his. He changes times and seasons; he deposes kings and raises up others. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning.

He reveals deep and hidden things; he knows what lies in darkness, and light dwells with him. I thank and praise you, God of my ancestors: You have given me wisdom and power, you have made known to me what **we** asked of you, you have made known to us the dream of the king."

# What did Daniel do after God answered his prayer?

Praised God!
Thanked God!

#### Philippians 4: 6 (NIV)

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God.

Who did God reveal the dream and interpretation to?

Who asked God to reveal the dream and interpretation?

### What can we learn from this?

#### Daniel 2: 24 (NASB)

Therefore, Daniel went in to Arioch, whom the king had appointed to destroy the wise men of Babylon; he went and spoke to him as follows: "Do not destroy the wise men of Babylon! Take me into the king's presence, and I will declare the interpretation to the king."

Did Daniel ask Arioch to take him to the king or did he tell him?

How do you think the king's number one hit man felt receiving orders from a foreign captive he is supposed to kill?

What did Daniel order Arioch to do with the wise men?

He actually vetoed the king's orders!

## Why would Daniel do this?

Where can a 17 year old kid get such boldness and compassion?

What can we learn from this?

#### Daniel 2: 25 (NASB)

Then Arioch hurriedly brought Daniel into the king's presence and spoke to him as follows: "I have found a man among the exiles from Judah who can make the interpretation known to the king!"

Why was Arioch in such a hurry to get Daniel to the king?

Do you think Arioch believed in Daniel?

# Who did Arioch give the credit to for finding Daniel?

#### Daniel 2: 26 (NASB)

The king said to Daniel, whose name was Belteshazzar, "Are you able to make known to me the dream which I have seen and its interpretation?"

# What will happen to Daniel if he cannot do what the king asks?

What will happen to Arioch?

Who do you think was sweating about this, Arioch or Daniel?

#### Daniel 2: 27 (NASB)

Daniel answered before the king and said, "As for the mystery about which the king has inquired, neither wise men, conjurers, magicians nor diviners are able to declare it to the king.

Do you think this is the answer Arioch was expecting? Is he sweating now?

Can you feel the king's blood beginning to boil?

Daniel 2: 28 (NASB)
However, there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries, and He has made known to King Nebuchadnezzar what will take place in the latter days. This was your dream and the visions in your mind while on your bed.

Does Daniel say that he can interpret the king's dream?

What does this demonstrate about Daniel's character?

### What can we learn from Daniel?

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
## What does the latter days mean?

From Daniel's day until Christ's return, also known as the time of the Gentiles.

#### Luke 21: 24

And Jerusalem will be trodden down by the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled.









#### Daniel 2: 29 (NASB)

As for you, O king, while on your bed your thoughts turned to what would take place in the future; and He who reveals mysteries has made known to you what will take place.

What was the king thinking about before he fell asleep when he had his dream?

Note: this is the first time God is referred to as He who reveals mysteries.

Notice that Daniel is not only telling the king his dream and interpretation, he is telling the king what he was thinking. How do you think the king felt knowing Daniel knew his thoughts?

## Do you believe that God knows your thoughts?

#### Psalm 94: 11

The LORD knows the thoughts of man, That they are a mere breath.

### Isiah 66: 18

"For I know their works and their thoughts; the time is coming to gather all nations and tongues. And they shall come and see My glory.

#### Ezekiel 11: 5

Then the Spirit of the LORD fell upon me, and He said to me, "Say, Thus says the LORD, "So you think, house of Israel, for I know your thoughts.

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### Psalm 139: 2

You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You understand my thought from afar.

#### Matthew 12: 25

And knowing their thoughts Jesus said to them, "Any kingdom divided against itself is laid waste; and any city or house divided against itself will not stand.

Since we know that God knows our thoughts, what should we do about it?

#### 2 Corinthians 10: 5

We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ
